The Chequers Hotel, Newbury

Within easy reach of London, the Chequers Hotel has been previously used for Rubicons in the 1980s and a Plokta.con in the early 2000s.

The hotel has a range of bedrooms available to the convention starting at £70 per night for small doubles which are to be used for single occupancy, £80 per night for standard doubles, executive doubles at £100 per night, and two-family rooms and two suites for either larger groups or a little more luxury. There are seven ground floor rooms in the old stable block, which we are reserving for members who have mobility problems or other disabilities. Please inform either me or Claire via corflu42@corflu.org if you will need one of these rooms and we will liaise with the hotel to make sure they go to the people most in need. We are relying on the fair mindedness of a group of people who are effectively all friends and part of a community to make sure everyone is accommodated as comfortably as possible over the weekend. All rooms come with breakfast, the doubles and suites offer at least two breakfasts per room.

Future PRs will detail at least some of the many restaurants and hostelries surrounding the hotel, as well as overflow hotel options; there is an abundance of choice, and Tommy and I should have no problems finding a pub showing the football over the weekend!
